The Nordic Symposium on Building Physics has been arranged every third year since 1987, making it one of the biggest and longest lasting international conferences focusing on building physics. The symposia have always been arranged in one of the five Nordic countries (Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway or Sweden), still it has grown to attract participants from all over the world. Typically more than half of the participating researchers are from other countries than the Nordic.

This 11<sup>th</sup> conference in the sequence was organized by The Norwegian University of Science and Technology (NTNU) and SINTEF. We experienced four fantastic days filled with interesting presentations, social events and networking. In total, we had 170 oral presentations/papers in three parallel sessions. The papers were all high quality papers selected through a thorough blind review process by the International Scientific Committee. 220 researchers, PhD, MSc-students and practitioners from 26 countries from all over the world were participating.

The sections of the conference were organized around the following topics: Passive and Low Energy Buildings, Moisture, Mould and Indoor Climate, Building Materials and Components, Building Envelope Systems, Towards Zero Emission Buildings, Climate Change and Climate Adaptation, Moisture Transport and Safety, Air-tightness and Air Movement & Retrofit and Conservation.

On behalf of the Organizing Committee we want to thank the members of the International Scientific Committee for their valuable contribution. We will also thank the authors for their contribution with papers, the session chairs, the keynote lecturers (Arild Gustavsen and Ruut Peuhkuri) and the regular participants of the conference. In addition, we also thank all that by service minded efforts and specific skills have made the conference possible: NTNU and SINTEF (organizers), NTNU Videre (conference organizer), Trondheim Municipality (concert in the Nidaros Cathedral), students and the entertainers at the social events.
